

Welcome and Orientation

Gathering Centering Music

Let the music fill your hearts and spirits as you come to recognize God's presence welcoming you in love.

Opening Act of Centering our Hearts as One

Pastor: Holy Living God, Heartbeat of Creation, help us to take this time to center on you, for you made us, you gave us life, and you continue to be with us

every moment...

every breath...

every step.

Hear this assurance from God:

[sing to the tune of Amazing Grace... if you aren't comfortable singing it, you can say it]

ALL: Be still, O heart, you're not alone, your beat is shared with me. Come now, and calm, and center here, you're mine, secure and free.

Pastor: Let's take another deep breath, making sure our shoulders and any tension we feel in our bodies is letting go with the breath. [Breath...] Let's take another one. [Breath...]

Let us pick up our heart stone, sometimes called a "worry stone," and let our touch on its surface remind us that God's touch is within us, between us, and around us.

As close and real as this object is in our hands right now, is how close Love is to us always.

Let us imagine letting go of our worries for now into God's heart of love.

We offer a prayer song of letting go:

ALL: Into your care, we offer now, our worries, fears and strife. We turn to you and know you're near—Your light, our love and life.

Opening Prayer

Epistle Reading

1 Peter 2:2-10

- ² Like newborn infants, long for the pure, spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow into salvation—³ if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good.
- ⁴ Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and ⁵ like living stones, let yourselves be built^[a] into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. ⁶ For it stands in scripture:
- "See, I am laying in Zion a stone,
 - a cornerstone chosen and precious;
- and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame."
- ⁷To you then who believe, he is precious; but for those who do not believe, "The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner,"
- ⁸ and "A stone that makes them stumble, and a rock that makes them fall." They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do.
- ⁹ But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, [c] in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light.
- ¹⁰ Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

Psalter Psalm 31:1-5, 15-16 UMH pgs. 764-765

In you, O LORD, I seek refuge;

do not let me ever be put to shame;

in your righteousness deliver me. ² Incline your ear to me;

rescue me speedily.

Be a rock of refuge for me,

a strong fortress to save me.

³ You are indeed my rock and my fortress; for your name's sake lead me and guide me,

- 4 take me out of the net that is hidden for me, for you are my refuge.
- ⁵ Into your hand I commit my spirit; you have redeemed me, O LORD, faithful God.
- ¹⁵ My times are in your hand; deliver me from the hand of my enemies and persecutors.
- ¹⁶ Let your face shine upon your servant; save me in your steadfast love.

Gospel Reading

John 14:1-14

14 "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe [a] in God, believe also in me. ² In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? [b] ³ And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also. ⁴ And you know the way to the place where I am going." [c] ⁵ Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" ⁶ Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. ⁷ If you know me, you will know [d] my Father also. From now on you do know him and have seen him."

⁸ Philip said to him, "Lord, show us the Father, and we will be satisfied." ⁹ Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know me? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? ¹⁰ Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own; but the Father who dwells in me does his works. ¹¹ Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; but if you do not, then believe me because of the works themselves. ¹² Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father. ¹³ I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. ¹⁴ If in my name you ask me^[e] for anything, I will do it.
