Preparing your home for Worship

Create a space that brings reminders of God's presence and a sense of waiting during Advent. Candle. Greenery. Advent wreath/candles. Bible. Stable. Make it a prayerful place. Ask everyone in your home for suggestions. Before the gathering time: play music, turn off devices not used for worship, start to pay attention to your breath as a gift from God. Pray. Worshiping together as house churches in the model of Acts 2:46-47.

Let the music fill your hearts and spirits becoming aware of God welcoming you in love.

Crossing the Threshold

This Advent, we are looking to hear words of comfort, of challenge and of good news. The prophet Isaiah and the four Gospel authors were writing in a time when people needed desperately to hear all of these as well. This first week, Isaiah, the prophet, and Mark—the Gospel writer who published first—reassure the people that good news is beginning and yet they both say, "Make yourself ready! Raise your voices, change your hearts, get ready to be transformed, because now is the time." Let us embrace hope that we can do what needs to be done to bring more light into the world.

One: Help us face this bleak night of the soul and embrace it as a womb of rebirth. Amen.

We Respond

Litany of Belief

Reader: In times when humanity disappoints, perhaps when even our own thoughts and behaviors disappoint, it is an important act to call out, name and claim, the consequences of our wrongs. And in times of distress it is a prophetic act to call out, name and claim, our belief in the hope for tomorrow. Hear these, our own statements of belief:

Reader: I believe that worry of displeasing others has stalled efforts at transformation AND

People: I believe that we can look deeper and hold onto the things that we have in common.

Reader: I believe that our fear of doubt makes us refrain from asking tough questions AND

People: I believe that asking tough questions in the face of injustice is faithful.

ALL: We believe, even when we are discouraged. We believe, that when we are discouraged, raising our voices for righting relationships will offer us hope!

Prayers in Stillness

As we share in prayer today you are encouraged to pray aloud your joys and concerns. Complete your prayer with "Lord, in your mercy" and all the people respond "Hear our prayer". (You are invited to write your prayers in the Chat or Comment feed. Also please email them to the church office so the Prayer Team may continue to pray with you during the week).

Pastor: I invite you to get in a comfortable position of rest. I invite you to get as quiet and still as you can. I invite you to a deep breath and a deep listening posture—perhaps eyes closed or fixed on a candle—as we prepare for a time of prayer.

Invitation to Christ's Table

Pastor: Our God, Song of the Ages, be with you.

People: And also wth you. **Pastor:** Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them up to the Lord.

Pastor: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Pastor: It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to raise our voices with you, tuning ourselves to you, creator of heaven and earth.

You filled the night of creation with music and light, setting in motion the rhythms of sunrise and sunset, of sound and silence. You formed within us your love song and breathed into us the breath of life.

Sometimes our voices are choked off and we cannot find your melody. But you keep the bass line humming, waiting for us to rejoin the chorus. You show up in the worst of times offering us the way to freedom in you. Your voice breaks through in prophets whose songs wake us up to the kin-dom you desire.

And so, with your people on earth and all the company of heaven we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

Now Mary sings her birthing song Till every voice can sing along And voices weak will rise up strong Her choir is one where all belong **Pastor:** Holy are you, and blessed is your Son Jesus Christ. Breaking forth into light from the blessed darkness of a womb, he brought light that illumined a path so we could see our way to more beloved community.

Your Spirit anointed him to raise his voice...
to preach good news to the poor,
to proclaim release to the captives
and recovering of sight to the blind,
to set at liberty those who are oppressed,
and to announce that the time had come
when you would save your people.
He healed the sick, fed the hungry, and ate with sinners
and invited us to do this too.

Born into a world of suffering, he suffered. Born into a world of senseless death, he died. Born into a world that needed hope, he rose, delivering us and proclaiming light and life the triumphal coda of life's song.

"Drink from this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Pastor: And so,

in remembrance of your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

ALL: Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

Pastor: Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here, and on these gifts of bread and fruit of the vine. Make them be for us your love and light so that our hearts may be broken open for the world and our lives poured out in service.

No one is saved till all are healed As Jesus on the Mount revealed Your life and mine forever sealed Just like the lilies of the field

Pastor: By your Spirit make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world. Mix our voices in harmony with each other until we sit at the same table and sing in the same choir in your Kin-dom on earth as it is in heaven.

Through your Son Jesus Christ with the Holy Spirit in your holy church, all honor and glory is yours, almighty God, now and forever.
