

#### Prayers and Donations Needed

The "John M" named in Wesley's prayer list for many months now is John

Miller. If you have been a part of Wesley for a while, you'll remember John, his wife Maureen, and their children Justin, Lucy and Sadie who were very active here at one time. Sadly, John was diagnosed in October 2021 with a fastgrowing form of liver cancer, Hepatocellular Carcinoma. John has undergone radiotherapy and is now awaiting a life-saving liver transplant. One of his co-workers has heroically volunteered and been approved as a live donor and the tentative date for surgery is May 16th at the VCU hospital in Richmond.

John is thankful that his health insurance should cover the anticipated cost of his and his donor's surgeries; however, many other financial needs are not covered by insurance. John and a caregiver will be required to remain in the Richmond area for a month after the surgery, and he'll need lodging, meals, travel costs, and medication not paid for by insurance. John's boss has established a gofundme account to help the family meet these expenses.



#### H.E.L.P. is Changing Lives

We are changing lives every day–finding housing for the homeless, offering more meals than ever before at our Day Center, and being a place of comfort and care for our brothers and sisters who just need a hand. We are adding staff for Healthcare Navigation and Housing Stabilization. Yet in the midst of all of these gains, we also run into challenges. Our Day Center is experiencing a surge of clients for the 2nd year in a row, averaging over 200 showers and 60 loads of laundry per month. *A Night's Welcome* grew by 65% this past season with 300 unique users, 5,600 bed nights of shelter, and 12,000 meals provided. We are running into space constraints due to the increased demand. I'm confident that our staff, our Board of Directors, and our community of support have the passion and vision to ensure the needs we're seeing are met in efficient *and* profound ways.
