The Advice of a Pumpkin: KG-TB-GTLB Keep Growing; Think Big; Give Thanks to Life's Bounty

In October, our church did our a Pumpkin Patch fundraiser. Together we are continuing to work for "green pastures and clean waters.—Jack Rezabek





H.E.L.P—A Night's Welcome

For the coldest weeks of the year, H.E.L.P. coordinates with over 30 area churches to provide a place that is safe and warm. "A Night's Welcome" is a nightly shelter, but its location changes throughout the season as area churches open their doors to those in need. With the help of many volunteers and organizations, two hot meals, toiletries, and community are provided for individuals and families that find themselves on the street each winter.

Every year, HELP provides over 6,600 bed nights of shelter for over 340 individuals, supported by nearly 17,000 hours of volunteer service from our community.

This year Wesley will continue to provide meals once a month for this important ministry. On November 22nd our United Women in Faith will be providing a meal. Watch for signups in the following months.





United Methodist Student Day November 26, 2023

United Methodist Student Day was the original Special Sunday founded by United Methodist Church Sunday Schools who collected offerings to help advance education for their children. The fund was originally established in 1872 as the Children's Fund. Today, United Methodist Student Day Sunday has the same purpose, calling upon the denomination to support their students as they prepare for life by adding knowledge to their faith.

Every year, General Board of Higher Education and Ministry awards an average of \$5.5 million in financial aid to United Methodist students. The offering taken on United Methodist Student Day is one opportunity to support these scholarships. Every dollar – **yes 100%** - received goes towards supporting and educating a new generation of principled Christian leaders for the church and the world. Supporting this Special Sunday is truly an investment in our future.

Currently, there are over 70 scholarships available for undergraduate, graduate, or doctoral United Methodist students. Financial support for all General Board of Higher Education and Ministry scholarships come from five primary sources: 63% from endowments; 22% from wills and annuities; 13% from United Methodist Special Sundays and 1% from online gifts and fiduciary income. All donations received empower and encourage our students that we are investing in them and our future.

We are blessed to support thousands of students through scholarships, but we would like to do more. Our funds are limited, and every awards cycle we end up with a large pool of qualified candidates who we are unable to help because there was no money left to give. You can help us change that! <u>Donate now</u> and help more students answer God's call to higher education.

In 2022, United Methodists gave \$224,000 to fund over 70 scholarships.
